# **Baby Blues**



# From Henry VIII to OKCupid: Portraits, The Original Selfies



Portraiture has been around since the Roman times, and for centuries, it was used in European society as a way of flaunting wealth and stature. It was a way to immortalise your memory as someone who mattered in the grand scheme of things.

Portraits were also able to tell suitors in far off lands what you looked like, which was helpful in times of political marriages between royal families. Famously Henry VIII's fourth wife, Anne of Cleves reportedly did not

look like her portrait; and this led Henry to annul the marriage 6 months after their wedding in 1540.

After the industrial revolution, and as social mobility began to take a bigger hold in England, portraiture became more socially available: although the skill was still primarily the domain of men. In the 1800s, young women would share their 'likeness' with potential suitors. These were small portraits that were commissioned by the upper middle classes with the hope that it would help their available daughters marry into money and stability. Think every Jane Austen novel.



This brings us to 2017 and the portrait course at the Worcester Arts Workshop, a course run by artist Andrew Clacher. It builds on classical learning from portraiture's rich past; whilst being open and welcoming to all regardless of experience. So, if you would like a Tinder profile photo that helps you stand out from the crowd; the course runs on Thursdays, 7-9pm in term time

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# PRIDE

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# The Elemental Sculpture Park Somerford Keynes, near Cirencester

I walk along a wooded path in the hazy sunshine until I come upon a beautifully manicured clearing in the trees. There are dragonflies everywhere. Suddenly one flies straight over my shoulder and lands on a bird's back - a swallow. The swallow doesn't move...it's made of wire and glass.

The Elemental Sculpture Park - home to almost 150 works of art - sits on the edge of the Cotswold Water Park near Cirencester. For a fine arts exhibition and saleroom it is singularly unpretentious - an entrance you could easily miss, as two cars ahead of me do, and a small gravelled car park leading to a neat tearoom and outdoor eating area.

But twenty metres down the pathway, you're into a completely different dimension. Huge flowers spring up directly from the earth, figures rest in between bushes, faces surround you, there's delicacy here, and power too with unfamiliar colours standing starkly out against the muted green and brown of the woodland backdrop. The stainless steel leaves of **Stuart** 

**Stockwell's** silent, dazzlingly beautiful mobile "Oak" move gently in the slight breeze, twisting, turning and rotating with great serenity.

Stainless steel also forms the medium for some of the most striking individual exhibits - Hillary Cartmel's "Janus" glares menacingly, while Carole Andrews' massive, organic flower sculptures "White Villosa" and "Red Villosa" tower above you like alien life forms, while her stunning blue aluminium work "Glandiflora" piles

flower upon flower as it lifts skyward. To my relatively untutored eye, Andrews is the star of this particular show - magnificent work.



As you walk deeper into the wooded areas, the natural copses and breaks in the trees are utilised for some pretty outstanding statuary. Peter Garrard's startling ceramic busts, "Adam and Eve" and an untitled large bust with the top of its head sheared off like a boiled egg have particular impact. Down a short fork in the path, the face of Pete Tatham's huge "Atlas" strains at the weight of the World on his shoulder.



The animal kingdom is represented by **Tanya Russel's** stately "Leopard Portrait", while in a rather more domestic vein, her "Yorkshire Terrier", extremely finely detailed, looks up expectantly at you while insects, ceramic and real are drawn to the riot of colour in **Renee Kilburn's** "Flowers".

There is literally something to interest everyone here.



The whole park will take you an hour or so to walk round, and the paths of two alternate routes are well marked, or like me you could just zig-zag randomly along, drawn to whatever piece catches your eye. It'll cost you a fiver to get in, with children under 13 at half that price. The Park is open until 30th September, but is closed on Tuesday and Wednesday.

## The linney Ring Annual Sculpture Trail

The Sculpture Trail around the gardens and ponds of the Jinney Ring Craft Centre has been running for over 10 years and usually exhibits over 100 different works of art. This trail is firmly fixed on both the general tourist and the art lover's map, and provides a great reason to plan a visit to the Worcestershire craft centre this September.

The trail features new as well as returning artists from around the country, creating an exhibition of dramatic sculptures with a range of media and subject matter, set against the stunning backdrop of the Malvern Hills. The placement of each piece offers inspiration for adding sculptural art to your own garden. All sculptures are for sale or commission, with prices to suit most pockets.

Key pieces on the trial are the striking abstract structures by Simon Probyn from Herefordshire who has been awarded a gold



medal this year for his garden display at the Hampton Court Flower Show. New to the trail are Liz Dixon who will exhibit a fisherman created from recycled materials, and Evesham artist Wendy Stafford's giant fused glass flowers.

The Jinney Ring Craft Centre is situated the picturesque village of Hanbury near Bromsgrove and is one of the most visited working craft centres in the West Midlands. It is home to 12 craft studios including glass blowing, textiles and woodwork.

The trail is an ideal opportunity for the centre to display





larger works of art than thev usually accommodate within their 200 year old barn buildings.

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
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# **Suz Winspear**

# **Ed Surname**

#### £47 budget from a laptop in Gloucester to the red carpet!

Ed Surname is a comedian from Gloucester who legitimately filmed his life for 20 years. He edited the footage himself into a real-life tragicomedy about whether following a childhood dream is the meaning of life or an unrealistic waste of time. Ed Surname's Unsolicited Material, which has seen the filmmaker go from that's the price of doing something editing on his laptop to the red carpet. That's right: a Grand Jury nominated movie on a budget of £47.



"Fans range from a professional psychiatrist to a diagnosed psychopath... surely SLAPmag readers will fall somewhere in-between, and as such will love the movie."

Ed explains, "for the press, the story is 'here's some nutter who filmed his life non-stop'. For me, and as fans of the film confirm, the story is what I actually did with the footage. I edited it into a satire on the masks that comedians wear. It exposes the illusion of fame."

Indeed, the offstage parts are what drive the narrative, which is "51% funny, 49% serious introspection". It speaks to our famehungry social media generation.

"The artists that my generation grew up with taught us that 'you can follow your dreams, never give up, you can do it'. I think that's a really important message but that a tweak or warning needs to be added to address the personal costs. My film adds that caveat."

It's very misunderstood, but that's literally never been done before. Is it a documentary or a mockumentary? It's both and neither. "Part cabaret, part performance art, part satire, part reality, part comedy, part tragedy."



"I edited the raw material in such a way that paints me as a deluded video blogger. I lived that story, but it's part of a more serious overall grassroots project designed to psychoanalyse why some people feel compelled to make a room of strangers laugh."

A personal victory for Ed and for the vlogging generation was Ed walking the red carpet at the IFF film awards in London, having been nominated for the Grand Jury award. "I didn't win, but it didn't matter. I was nominated for 4 awards, it's played around the world and I'm sat with people who are teams of lifelong professional filmmakers with £20k budgets. I am one person, and I did it myself with Pinnacle Studio 14 and by not compromising my vision whatsoever."

"If you go for something where the chance of failure is spectacular, you've already won."

"But never before, and never again".

# Nick Parker The Marrs Bar, Worcester | Sunday, Sept 10th

Glastonbury based **Nick Parker** started gigging in his early teens playing mandolin and singing in folk/rock/skiffle band '**Why?**', and spent the next 10 years bouncing around on stages at hundreds of venues and festivals around the UK and Europe. In 1998 Nick called it a day with Why? and started guitar band '**Tobermory**'. After various false starts, a few flirtations with industry 'big' boys and a few tours in Germany, Tobermory played their last gig in 2004.

In 2010 Nick embarked on a solo career and has since released two full-length albums, 2010's 'The King of False Alarms' and 2014's 'Angry Pork and the Occasional Bird'. His third album 'Besta Venya' was released this year.

Over the years Nick has had the pleasure of sharing the stage with The Wedding Present, Bright Eyes, Ben Marwood, Frank Turner, Mike Peters and Mike Scott among others, and he regularly tours with Bristol based Gaz Brookfield (as a separate act, but also playing mandolin in his band).

### **Skating Polly & Hands Off Gretel** The Prince Albert, Stroud | Sat 12th Aug

The glorious musical oasis that Lotte Lyster and Miles Connolly have created at The Prince Albert on top of Rodborough Hill in Stroud attracts the most amazing variety of top quality acts - the amount of bands especially that top and tail their UK and International tours here is staggering. The latest in that long and distinguished list are **Skating Polly** from Washington, on their third UK tour and another in a string of fine bands I've seen this year from Leeds, Hands Off Gretel.

Hands Off Gretel are a perfectly self-contained DIY cottage industry, who have built up a tremendous following by solid gigging and releasing a stream of very darkly humorous and startling videos produced in-house with impeccable quality and shot by singer Lauren's mum, Helen Tate. The theatricality that makes the videos stand out is carried onto stage as singer Lauren Tate makes her entrance. She is dressed rather like a deranged Victorian gothic doll, complete with mismatched bedsocks and in these times of ripped jeans and elderly favourite band tee-shirts,



she is a woman who clearly isn't afraid to stand out. She is also responsible for the band's in-yer-face graphics style, complete with eye-catching/watering colour palette. Very bold. Very effective.

She starts by explaining about the lack of a regular bass player - the excellent Becky Baldwin has been touring with them - then proceeds to strap on a bass, picks out the first thunderous notes and we're off... For a three piece, this band makes a big fat sound and even in the confines of The Albert the place is soon bouncing. The music straddles a line between grunge and postpunk, much of it drawn from their excellent debut album "Burn The Beauty Queen".



Sean Bon on guitar ramps up the sonic blast in fine style, his sparse but very long dreads making it seriously hazardous to stand too close when he's in full flight (I certainly got a clip round the ear with one, and I suspect I wasn't the only one) while drummer Sam Hobbins cracks out a fierce beat, quickly discarding his cap in the heat to reveal a fine toxic waste coloured mop. Tate's voice is amazing, growling, shrieking, coaxing - simply wonderful. And her bass playing? You'd be struggling to spot that she wasn't a regular. Thoroughly professional.

So, so difficult to pick out highlights such is the quality of the music but the intensely grungy 'Bad Egg' and the flat out belter, 'One Eved Girl' probably shade it. Astonishing.

And we're all still reeling when Skating Polly take the stage and proceed to just about finish us off.

This is another three-piece sonically punching well above its weight with step-sisters Kelli Mayo and Peyton Bighorse joined by Kelli's brother, Kurtis on drums. They've been established quite

a while and are two albums and an EP to the good and if you're looking for comparisons, which I rarely do, I suppose Bikini Kill and Babes in Toyland would be your nearest point of reference. This means that there's a solid post-punk core to the music, but the thick swathes of melody and the crashing transitions from muted harmonies to startling bursts of power move performance way, way



above its origins. They call it 'ugly pop' and that's a pretty apt description.

And there's the vocals oh my word... Mayo, as well as sporting a bass unusually shorn of its bottom string, takes the lead at the start of the set and she does have a fabulous voice with her very slender frame frequently going up on tiptoe to fire the vocals out. Bighorse starts off supplying top quality support vocals but as the set progresses the lead begins to shift to the guitarist and finally settles on a dual attack the like of which I haven't heard in a



long time. Forget gentle two-part harmonies, 'Ugly' virtually takes your ears off, 'Perfume For Now' has crescendo after crescendo and best of all the out-and-out attack of 'Alabama Movies' just leaves you breathless. There's much subtlety as well with 'Pretective Boy' and 'Louder in Outer Space' outstanding.

And driving all this on is a very fine performance indeed on drums by Kurtis Mayo - some of this music is very complex in terms of time change and variations in volume but he's always spot on with just the right amount of balance between subtlety and aggression. Ace sticksman. But right at the end of the set, there's a surprise - Mayo leaves his drums, Bighorse leaves her guitar and they swap places - something I haven't seen for a long time. So skilful are the two of them that the transition is seamless but Mayo does take one of his sticks with him, using it both to thump the strings and to use like a violin bow. Impressive from the pair of them. We get a much requested encore, with a guest appearance from Lauren Tate, then the merch desk is rightly enveloped in a rugby scrum of delighted fans.

One of those evenings when you wish the music could go on forever - absolutely outstanding. Geoffrey Head

### **Matt Woosev and Band** The Prince Of Wales, Ledbury | 30th July

I've had the pleasure of listening to Matt's solo sessions on countless occasions and with Dave Small at his side on innumerable times but here in the fabulous little Ledbury pub, Matt had brought his mostly German band along to squeeze in to the tight confines of the POW.

Hogging far too much space at the rear was Dave Small with his drum kit and to the left was Michael with keyboard and guitar to hand whilst on the right I found Ralph on guitar with Lukas on bass. Meanwhile, Matt sat with his array of acoustic guitars, primed and ready. He 'warmed' the audience with a solo and, forever a Rory Gallagher fan, 'Out On The Western Plane' followed and Matt's own superb 'Elsie May'.

Matt dialled back through his recordings to pull out the ever popular 'Cruel Disposition', just the 'Same Old Blues' really. 'Let It Flow' glided by as a whipped cream topping, revealing Lukas and Dave setting a funky rhythm that was smoothed over by the layering of 3 guitars. This was the last day of the UK tour so spirits were high and, with whiskey at hand, they were going to play straight through before rushing off for the flight back to Germany, leaving just Dave playing with his sticks. 'I've Seen The Bottom' pulses out, the lyrics painting a familiar picture for some as the darkest of blues is quickly erased by the soft floating clouds and clear light of 'One Love' from Matts Desiderata album.

Desiderata took Matt on new journey. For many, it was a sort of Marmite album but I happen to love Marmite. Embedded in that landmark recording is 'Lighthouse', a strangely haunting and ethereal, sometimes disjointed even, track. I've heard it played many times, each time it seems to reveal different nuances,

hidden cracks and beautiful curves. Here, in the tight confines of the POW, where the acoustics are as remarkable as the pub, 'Lighthouse' was about to be powered up by a full-on band. Does this one song deserve a full paragraph? It's an unreserved yes: the synergy between Ralph. Matt and Michael was outstanding as Dave and Lukas laid down an outstanding rhythm for the complex lattice to be woven. Meanwhile, Wildest Dreams brought us 'Don't Tell Nobody' which shares the bittersweet taste of a velvety Noire chocolate, dark and threatening but superbly unwrapped and offered up.



There was only one way a Woosey gig was going to end. The European collective had almost played itself out so it was time to gather up the kindling, light the fire and watch the 'Black Smoke Rising'. Matt was driving hard, beads of perspiration on his face as his voice fill every corner of this Blues church, a final prayer for the Sunday congregation who spellbound in the glorious Prince Of Graham Munn

# **Lost Tiger to the Wild**

Jokingly referred to as the rock and roll version of the Thompson Twins (who were not real twins mind you!) brothers **Alfie and Zack Jeavons-Fellows** are on the straight way to stardom. Their sudden appearance on Worcester music scene less than a year ago was a true musical knock out. Powerful riffs, rhythmic beats combined with talent for writing songs you cannot get out of your head, proved to be a winning combination. We have caught up with the skilled duo to speak about their early success, getting noticed and their upcoming music.

SLAP: You are identical twins, we are not seeing double, are we?

**Alfie:** (laughing) Yes, we are identical twins; born a minute apart. I'm the older of us both.

**SLAP:** Lost Tiger to the Wild is an interesting name for a band half poetic and half cryptic. Can you explain where it came from?

**Alfie:** We found the phrase in a book. The quote read "We have lost a tiger to the wild". We liked the way the words worked together, so we went with 'Lost Tiger to the Wild'. For us the name is about being free and independent.

**SLAP:** Are you working with any other local musicians? Do you have a backing band that is supporting you on stage on special occasions?

**Alfie:** Yes, we do. We've added a bass and lead guitarist for a recent live gig, which was really good for us because we were able to experiment with the solid guitar sound that Lost Tiger is about.

**SLAP:** BBC Introducing gave you one of the best recommendations we have seen in years. "Great guys, great melodies, great live shows, great future ahead of them". It is not easy to impress people who listen to music for a living.

Alfie: (laughing again) People who listen to live music for a living are our best critics. Honest feedback is what helps us drive forwards. The BBC Introducing chaps were really good to work with, funnily enough we bumped in to Andrew Marston after our Coventry University gig and we see Andy O'Hare all over the place. Good blokes.

**SLAP:** You are represented by prestigious Coalition Talent Entertainment Agency in London, responsible for shaping careers of well-known acts such as Shoala Ama, Pixie Lott, The Wombats or Artful Dodger. How did your partnership begin?

Alfie: Once our social media started to kick off, we found several agents were getting in touch. Rather than leap at the first offer we have received, we waited for a proven talent management team that could help push our careers on. Coalition got in touch in February, making some really positive noises so we met with them in London and soon agreed to work together. Being part of the Coalition stable gives us a chance to perform with lots of other professional artists.

SLAP: We have to ask about our favourite track, Remember to Breathe. You played it at the BBC session at the Railway in Redditch to rave reviews and great compliments from the crowd. It is a powerful track with thoughtful lyrics. Tell us more about this and roll thir song.

Zac: I have had the chorus riff for ages and loved the way it sounded with a decent fuzz pedal. Alf developed the song without lyrics a lot and it still sounds exactly the same. Coming up with lyrics to compliment the gritty sound was a struggle until I heard a bluesy song called "Remember to Breathe" written by Australian busker, Owen Campbell. It just clicked. With a little bit of tweaking, the lyrics fitted perfectly over my verse and chorus. We love it. Hope Owen will too, when he hears it.



**SLAP:** Lost Tiger was only founded in November 2016 and you have been performing extensively ever since. Your achievements are most impressive: on 17th of May you played at the sold out CUSU Summer Ball 2017 at the legendary Coventry University Students' Union supporting Tinie Tempah; on the 10th of June you supported Lethal Bizzle at University of Essex and recently you headlined a gig for UNCOVER sessions night in Worcester. Where are you going to play next?

Alfie: Our next gig is the Monmouthshire Filthy Girl Mud Run After party at the beginning of September. We played the sister event in Derbyshire about a month ago which was great fun. The crowd was really up for it. Top gigs are all about the audience.

**SLAP:** On 22nd of September you will return to Marrs Bar in Worcester to take part in Musicians Against Homelessness initiative in support of Crisis (charity combating homelessness). This nation-wide musical event is championed by Alan McGee, the founder of Creation Records and manager of Primal Scream, Oasis and The Libertines. Are you preparing anything special for the night?

**Alfie:** The Marrs Bar is the home of original music in Worcester so we'll definitely be playing our own music. If everything goes well, we're hoping to debut a couple of new tracks. We're really pleased to be part of the event.

**SLAP:** Outside of your musical careers, you are very keen on sports, especially rugby. You both play for Stourbridge RFC, also with great success. We hope you are not thinking about a sudden career-change.

**Zac:**: No, don't worry! We're really into music; it's what we really want to do

**SLAP:** Last but not least – the fun question. Tell us the most rock and roll thing that has happened to you so far.

**Zac:** I think it'd be best if we keep that one to ourselves... if you ask us face to face we may answer differently.



### **New Release**

### The Naughty Corner | Changing Behaviour

Weather wise, this summer has been changeable at best. Sure, in June we had a few sunny spells, July was a write off and this month... well at times it's felt more like Autumn. But as I throw the second album by 'ukulele fundamentalists', **The Naughty Corner**, on the player, the sun is shining, the temperatures on the rise and once again there are smiles on the street. A coincidence? somehow, I think not!

Much like the band's debut, *Ukulele Fundamentalists*, the band's follow up *Changing Behaviour*, is a summery mix of well known covers and instant, hook-laden originals featuring three part harmonies, strummed and plucked strings and the odd kazoo solo thrown in for good measure.

Opening the ten track album with a cover of Cannon & Ball's old theme tune *Together We'll Be OK*, seems an odd yet inspired choice The song is a summery foot tapper that's perfect for the **Naughty Corner** treatment with he trio's harmonies shining from the off. The aforementioned Kazoo makes a welcome appearance around the half

way mark adding to the fun factor, and as ever with The Naughty Corner, the group sound like they're having a blast, you can almost see them grinning from ear to ear as the two minute ditty plays out. The band's own *First World Problems* continues that wonderfully upbeat vibe as they lament such problems as losing the remote and only being able to buy creme eggs at Easter,

before delivering their own contagious, care free manifesto that includes such sing-a-long couplets as "let's all sing like no one's listening, let's live for today, let's all dance like no ones watching, we don't care what they say" accompanied by those ever infectious Ukes.

From there, the album continues to be an absolute joy, from the retro crooned title track to the wonderfully silly, acappella led, Love My Hats (complete with such addictive lyrical nonsense as 'I Adore Your Fedora, you thrill me in your trilby, you never frown in

a crown'). It's nigh on impossible to control your foot from tapping and the desire to join the band on harmonies. Whilst the choice covers of Johnny Burnette's Your Sixteen and Save Your Kisses For Me, really play to the band's strengths. The former features a whistled intro and a superb, heartfelt, crooned lead. Whilst the latter has always been an obligatory guilty pleasure, hum-a-long and it's no different in the hands of the Naughty Corner who once again use the opportunity to showcase those (should be award) winning harmonies. Whilst the likes of the Corner's The Girl Upstairs, a spritely, ragged take of Folsom Prison Blues and a hidden cow punk bonus track

proves, an ever growing, diverse and rich array of influences seeping into an already potent, engaging and above all fun melting pot.

Changing Behaviour should be the summers official soundtrack, as **The Naughty Corner** once again deliver an addictive, smile inducing set of undeniable sing-a-long Uke classics. Will Munn





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# **Chevy Chase Stole My Wife Haitian Honeymoon**

Having seen Worcester alternative fizzy popsters Chevy Chase Stole My Wife for the first time at this year's Lakefest, and

instantly falling for their energetic set, I was more than intrigued to hear whether the band could capture their addictive live sound on CD. So having a copy of the band's brand new, third EP, Haitian Honevmoon thrust into my sweaty palms. I was eager to get home and dive right in.

From the first spin the CD had me grinning like a loon (or indeed CCSMW's own lead smiler, I mean singer, Emma Howett), the fourtrack is bubbly, fun and damn addictive. Opening with Saff Box's elastic bass groove and Neil Burton's tapped out rhythm. This Is Art Calling is rather akin to opening a

pre-shaken can of coke that erupts into a gloriously, frothy fountain of contagious fizz, complete with sugary pop harmonies and a rush of spiky (Stu Silcock) indie guitars. One sip is never enough as that bubbly sound has coming back for more.

Likely Story continues the impressive start, opening with a thunderous rumble around the kit, before a striking, buzzing riff joins the mix. Howett enters the fray delivering a cool as ice lead vocal complimented by the cooed harmonies of Box, creating an intoxicating sound that had me reminiscing Swedish indie pop heroes (and personal favourites) The Sounds - (high praise indeed). And like their Nordic neighbours CCSMW soon had me humming


> along in delight. Dust is three and half minutes of serrated pop perfection that really sees the band cut lose. Silcock (and Howett) dish up a glorious collection of instant riffs and tasty solo thrills, whilst throwing in subtle key changes. Box and Burton groove and anchor, driving the song onwards and then there's those glorious harmonies and 'catchier than the common cold' refrains that have you searching for the repeat.

> If the three previous tracks weren't already impressive enough, the EP's grand finale, I Fell In Love With A Tightrope Walker, seals the deal with a frantic, near two minute punky rush that'll have you practically bouncing off the walls in glee. It's a fun, frenzied closer, that much like a Chevy Chase Stole My Wife gig will have you panting for more.

I maybe late to the CCSMW party, but with releases like Haitian Honeymoon, I sure won't be leaving anytime soon!!


#### The Woo Town Hillbillies | You Count It In...

# **Review**

### Jinney Ring Blues Festival | 5th Aug

The blues festival is now a well-established weekend festival at the gorgeous setting of the **Jinney Ring** in Hanbury, Worcestershire. The Friday evening had seen **Big Joe Bone** entertain the campers here for the weekend. Campers is not really a true description as most seem to be motorhomes - whatever happened to leaky canvas, primus stoves and baked beans? The essence of the festival is the Saturday with its field based Cider and Beer marquee alongside the 'kitchen' where arguably the very best of festival food can be found.

Self-professed bluesmaster, funkateer and master of wit & repartee and Guv'nor of Ealing, **Robert Hokum** opened the stage asking the same question as many of us: 'Why The Hell Wasn't I Born Rich', before Johnny B Goode walked by doing 'The Lambeth Walk'. Ever popular, Robert has been delivering his blues, whether electric with a band, or solo acoustic for many years, there's plenty of serious, classic blues to add to the lighter stuff. Blind Willie Johnson's, spiritual 'Nobody's Fault But Mine' is one covered by many, from Nina Simone to Led Zeppelin and here by Bob Hokum.

Stompin' Dave lives up to his name. A multi-instrumentalist who happens to wear steel tipped wooden soled shoes which are put to plenty of use astride his stomping platform. He brandished guitar, banjo, fiddle and harp, not all at the same time, playing everything well, explaining why Dave has reaped so many awards.

A bit of Scott Joplin Ragtime sets the scene but 'Now's The Time' naturally lead to a bit of tap. A swampy 'What Am I Supposed To Do' adds the harp to the guitar as the clogs keep working, just squeezing in a personal favourite 'St James Infirmary Blues' before switching to the banjo. A stunning banjo driven instrumental of 'Bonaparte's Retreat' and, as the rain drifted in, Dave played on with a quick boogie before getting back to the guitar to 'Bottle Up & Go'.

**Greg Coulson** was new to me. He brings his own style of R&B along with his band which he fronts with vocals and a mix of guitar and Hammond organ. There's plenty of funky drum and bass for 'Stitch Me Up' with Greg turning to his keys for a dynamic, organic



even, swirl of organ to drift across the fields. More funk was revealed in the lost and regained love of a jazz fused 'Sick Note'. Greg has a fine voice to go with his dynamic keyboard attack whilst not forgetting the Fender Jazzmaster slung across his shoulders. Greg reached back in time to an old 1930's song that was later brought to prominence by Peggy Lee: the jazzy blues of 'Why Don't You Do Right'. It was a steamy song that also featured in the film Who Framed Roger Rabbit which Greg also plunders for the madassed 'Squatt That Rabbit'. Greg is about to release his first album 'What's New', it's worth waiting for I suspect.



The stage became a hive of activity as it was reset for **The Della Grants**, a band that is rapidly making headway in the blues arena. Most of their material comes from within and is played with the effervescent fizz of a glass of Andrews! The line up at the Jinney Ring included **Terry Robinson** on keyboards and an occasional, but significant, trumpet. Andy is on bass, **Tom Walker** on percussion, **Tom Best** on guitar and vocals and Max on lead vocals and guitar. Tom B also adds a mean harp to the mix, evident in the hard driving 'Backbiter Blues' from their First Fix EP.

Not sure who the 'Weaker Man' is but Terry came in with a lovely muted trumpet adding extra colour. Though the Della Grants write some fine, crowd pleasing music, there has to be the odd cover to tantalise the taste buds. Tom takes on the lead for a stunningly good 'Stormy Monday', a song that wrings out every drop of emotion. If I'd heard nothing else this day, I would have come away satisfied. But, there was still more to come, not least a new, yet to be released on record 'Sunrise'. Inspired by the young families of Max and Tom B, it reaches down into the soul with Max's finely grated voice dripping with passion. Terry adds some muted notes and turns back to the keyboard in time to rock out on 'The River', with its tribal rhythm set by Andy and Tom W.

How do you follow that? Why not bring on the Wilde man of harmonica. Will that is. Next to Will stood the colossus Danny Giles with guitar in hand, ready to rock. A pulsating 'If I Get My Hands On You' found vocals tailing with his harp. Another Willie provides a follow on in the form of Willie Dixon and the soulful blues of 'I Can't Hold Out'. His rendition Gary Moore's. 'Parisienne' Walkways' is jaw dropping, before he provides another great classic, taking a



tin opener to Canned Heat's 'On The Road Again'. For me Will's albums never seem to quite capture hearing him perform live, the energy and reed bending ability are unquestionable.

The evening was destined to close on music to get everyone up and dancing into the dark with Birmingham based **Souled Out To Funk** bringing back the memorable sounds of James Brown, Stevie Wonder, Al Green and many more.

# **Dream State**

### The Frog & Fiddle, Cheltenham | Friday 11th Aug

**Dream State** are a five-piece from South Wales, who on the strength of only a handful of (admittedly excellent) videos and one EP have built up a very healthy following indeed.

About two minutes into the first song at a well attended **Frog and Fiddle**, it's very easy to see why and very easy to understand why they're heading for the Reading and Leeds Festivals later this month.

"Dynamic" scarcely covers it they absolutely launch themselves their music without compromise, it's not overloud but the power just blows you away. They also launch themselves physically, being one of the most mobile bands I've ever seen, except thankfully drummer Jamie Lee who contents himself with propelling the music forward with a thunderously pinpoint display. Bass player Danny Rayer links up with him perfectly to provide a dense backdrop for the twin guitar attack of Aled Rhvs Evans and Rhys Wilcox, who both also provide excellent support vocals,

to lay down some fierce and highly memorable riffs over the top.

Evans also adds economical and precise solos with a sound bidextral technique.

Which of course, leaves the main vocals – and what a vocalist that is. The enigmatically named 'CJ' is a diminutive powerhouse of a frontwoman with a truly extraordinary voice.

Neither a shouter nor a screamer, there is just a smooth

progression up the volume scale to a fearsome crescendo and unlike a lot of singers I've seen this year, her pitch doesn't degrade when she switches from clean to guttural or when she hikes the power up. And power is required as well—this is post-hardcore music but with a distinctly melodious alt-rock influence. She makes several incursions into the audience, joining in with the small but recklessly enthusiastic mosh at one point, and when she stops and sings right in front of you, briefly skewering you with a stare. It's wonderfully disconcerting.

The set is tragically short, but we are treated to the "Consequences" EP in its entirety, plus a brand new song and the recent single 'White Lies' - but they undoubtedly leave the best until last with a long version of 'Rebuild, Recreate', for my money the outstanding track on the EP.

Facebook tentatively suggested I might like this band – Facebook was right.

# **Howard James Kenny** The Old Pheasant, Worcester | Thurs 24th Aug

The cosy calm of **The Old Pheasant** in Worcester was the setting for a performance by local singer-songwriter **Howard James Kenny**. Howard's music takes influence from diverse and eclectic sources: folk, pop, ambient, post-rock and more. Like many singer-songwriters, he is equipped with acoustic guitar and voice, however he has another trick up his sleeve: at his feet is a pedalboard boasting an impressive array of effects.

The first half of the set is comprised of covers, the pedalboard barely touched, deft, languid guitar and pure, falsetto vocals bringing Howard's own style to familiar tunes. Songs by Dolly Parton, Bruno Mars and Jack Johnson get the audience into a laid-back, upbeat vibe. Queen's Crazy Little Thing Called Love and Al Green's Let's Stay Together are personal highlights of this part of the set. Howard's impressive vocal range and subtle yet precise guitar work more than do these songs justice.

After a quick break, the second half of the set begins, and this is where Howard really shows off his remarkable musical ability. From now on he plays his own original compositions (with the exception of a sublime cover of Massive Attack's classic 1998 single *Teardrop*). His clear

vocal style is reminiscent of singer-songwriters such as Nick Drake and Elliot Smith, while his moody and atmospheric instrumental arrangements evoke Sigur Ros and Brian Eno.

Howard's songs typically begin with sparse guitar melodies, before building gradually to grand crescendos, each part (guitar, vocals, claps, percussion) performed by himself and layering over each other with the use of a loop pedal. The result sounds more like a full band performing than one man sitting on a barstool in a pub with his guitar.

Tracks from his 2011 album *Shelter Songs* are performed, from *Good Fortune* and its ghostly backwards-tape effect to Insects,

complete with haunting looped vocal chants that build to create a hymnal sound to accompany peaceful fingerpicked guitar. Howard skilfully uses this combination of technology and compositional talent to construct hypnotic soundscapes which balance folky, organic guitar music with ethereal textures. The end result is both introspective and expansive.

As *Insects* fades out in a dreamlike haze, Howard sings a brief acappella extract of The Carpenters' 1970 hit *Close to You*, which echoes to silence to end the evening. The set displayed Howard's considerable talents at both accessible acoustic pop and more experimental original compositions.





## **Big Wolf Band** The Prince of Wales, Ledbury | 6th Aug

Jonathan Earp and his Birmingham based band are making serious inroads into the UK Blues scene. Big Wolf has topped the Amazon Blues Singles charts in 2015 with 'Depression Blues' and

2016s 'Stop Right Now'. The debut album 'A Rebels Story', has received great reviews from around the world. Essentially a rock blues outfit, here at the POW Jonathan's well-crafted songs and covers are to be exorcised on his guitar, ably assisted by Mick Jevnes on bass. Tim Jones on percussion and Paul Brambani on keys.

The resulting combination is measured but scintillating electric blues which fill out The Prince Of Wales in the Sunday sessions. The pearly gates are open for business and 'Heavens Got The Blues'. Jon's guitar talks as his strong vocals, suitably etched by sand blasting, fill the air.

A shuffling, piano induced 'Done Wrong By You' feeds you in

gently toward a fabulously rocking 'Hot Headed Woman'. A simply beautiful, soul drenched and passionate 'Darkest Of My Days' weeps out as a spell is cast. The sultry 'If I Ever Loved Another Woman' eases through the aged timbers of the Prince, every

nuance squeezed from the plummy Yamaha. These 3 songs penned by Jonathan Earp are worthy of seeking a copy of the album as they are simply spellbinding. Here, live, in this wonderful old Sunday church of the blues, they sound sublime, stretched, embellished and performed with passion. A biting hard, driving ZZ Top's 'I Been Up I Been Down' show Mick and Tim push the rhythm hard as Jon weaves his guitar over the top, a prelude to the storm coming in 'Rolling With Thunder'.



'Depression Blues' is a lovely honey edged pulsating blues with a suitably haunting vet hypnotic feel. The guitar cries, taking us on a tough journey as Paul's Hammond feeds in and subtle guitar notes feather us down. Just the strings pulse, keeping it alive in the hushed bar as Tim applies the shock, kicking it back into life. The band powers in for a brilliant run to the close. Forced to leave

for the train, I just catch the R n' B of 'Long Time Mary', Paul's Boogie piano notes decorating the effervescent feel of the song.

It's good to catch up with The Big Wolf Band again, Jonathan sings his Rebels Story in style and the guitar totally absorbs you as Mick Tim and Paul create the full package: live music at its best.

# **Swampcandy** The Chestnut, Worcester | Sun 20th Aug

Now an annual event, American duo Ruben Dobbs and Joey Mitchell in the guise of Swampcandy, dropped in for their Sunday Evening session of raw edged, high energy swamp blues. For the benefit of those who have never stumbled into a cement mixer full of broken bricks, Ruben is the big guy, playing resonator and acoustic guitars, gritting out hard edged lyrics. Joey is the long haired, tub thumping, double bass player kicking hell out of his foot drum. I do happen to know he managed to break the duplexed chain drive of the pedal before Gloucester Blues, a riveting bit of info for you all.

'Mad Pierre' had been chewing through his trombone in anticipation of this gig, sadly the trombone still worked, though I think he'd been rehearsing his lines.

I am going to attempt to work in some songs that are on the latest, 'exclusive' album recorded live in The Land Of Horses And Divorces. But first, Joey is punching out the rhythm as Rubin warms into the session with 'If You See My Baby', before slipping into the depths for 'Devil Devil' to the deep metallic twang of the res, straight from the new CD. Needless to say, with such satanic reverence, you could pack your bags and put the 'Devil in A Suitcase', tearing off like a rocket. Nearly time for some 'Positive Drinking', a gentle lament that requires glasses to be charged, which they were, ready for the malty notes of 'Drink Whiskey With Me', cheers. Glasses drained, magically a bottle of Islay appeared!

By now I'd given up trying to ID the new songs, but recognised the familiar lyrics of a classic 'Death Letter Blues' rattled out like loose change in an empty bean tin. Ruben and Joey soon had her

laying on the coolin' board. Did they do 'Hard Times' off that CD? Damned if I know, but they should of done, a really soulful slow burner by Swampcandy standards. The tribal rhythms of 'Heard Somebody' wailed out, but the pace soon picks up, for the meanest woman You ever seen, asked for whiskey, gave me gasoline, doubt Fred McDowell would recognise his song.

'Its A Good Day', as near to gospel as your gonna get with Swampcandy, and 'Pierre' awaken to the calling, the trombone is out again, he could have an eye out with that in this crowd. Time to 'Tell The Boys' to go home, Joey raps the big bass, Ruben gets the finger picks to work, only two strings broken this evening, that's quite good. Having just thrown everyone out, perversely, 'Baby Please Don't Go', stopped the flow.

Disappointed not to be bludgeoned by, 'Baseball Bats And Bear Traps', it had nonetheless been a 'barstorming' evening, which, just maybe, will be repeated next year. Graham Munn



# **Semantics** | Acid Test

**Semantics** are a four-piece Birmingham based band who first formed back in 2014, immediately making a splash with their dark brooding mix of post-punk and striking indie noir. The band quickly picked up support in their home town leading to a series headline shows and support slots with the likes of The Vryll Society,

Esque and Field Studies among others. The band continued to turn heads with the release of their debut EP in 2016, gaining the attention of such taste makers Louder Than War. Counteract and The Independent whilst the rest of the year saw the continue to hone their craft live, showcasing brand new material along the way.



Following a bout of recording with Ryan Pinson, the Semantics return with a brand new EP entitled 'Acid Test' which, if the title track is anything to judge on, is set to propel the band into the indie loving nation's conscience as the foursome up the ante with a startling, attention grabbing opening salvo. The track, with its suitably grey and moody video, opens with a repetitive, driving, icy riff courtesy of **Bridie Green** before the rumbling bass of **Josh RB** 

joins the mix. That's followed quickly with the drums of **Simon Lees** and the brooding, bruised vocals of **Rob Lilley** as the band conjure memories of Joy Division at their peak (Lilley summoning the ghost of Curtis, whilst a downcast Morrissery documents the seance) or in more recent times, fellow Birmingham blackened soul indie act. The Editors.

The song bodes well for the rest of the EP as that memorable, jagged riff and Lilley's croon hang heavy in the air, long after the four plus minutes have played out, urging the listener to plunge back between the shadows for another blast of indie noir.

This is the first full album from Mike and his band which they launched at the Marrs Bar in Worcester a couple of months ago - now I don't often listen to recorded music as I'm completely incapable of multitasking in any way - so it's taken a little while for me to actually sit down for a while and check this rocking offering out - but very glad I did!

Many of you will know Mike as the Jack Sparrow-esque rock-god character who's guaranteed to amuse and offend in roughly equal proportions (a good balance we think!) when he's performing

with his support outfit the STDs - named of course after individual members Steve, 'The' Jack and Dean. Ok I'm already pushing credibility a bit but you probably guessed that was going to happen sooner rather than later with any Mike Knowles-related event - so best we get it out of the way now... But in all fairness he's very capable of playing a smoother set of less contentious numbers when in solo mode - though perhaps weddings and barmitzvahs are a little remote at present...

2017 has seen Mike take a wholly more professional attitude to his undoubted guitar and entertainment skills - he's moved on from being the linchpin of the Marrs Bar House Band to festivals and headlining gigs and this his first full album is evidence of this development - kicking off with with the speed-metal *Addicted To Crazy* and *Lost My Mind* which tells you straight away that this is a chap with quality, classic and original riffs in abundance!



Tomorrow and Prey slow it down a little but give Mike's vocal capabilities more scope with some inventive and thoughtful lyrics. The Joker is a psychobilly-ish heavy thrash and nicely sets up the stunningly standout track Scars On The Inside which with a radio

edit would easily deserve national airplay - in my view alone worth getting this record for! More thoughtful ditties to close off this standout recording with *Overtime*, *Feels Like Home* and *Mouldy Lung* with no let-up in the quality of melody or lyrics.

The CD design looks great but there's absolutely no information on the artist, lyrics, music, date, content or contact inside the sleeve - easily amended but should have spotted and corrected! Mike's debut album isn't totally perfect (and of course isn't for the easily-offended) but this is a magnificent compilation of medium-core metal-rock with many incredible and original riffs from an extremely talented very live, local and original musician - very well worth checking out!

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# **Lakefest** | 10th-14th Aug

**Lakefest**, now in its second year at Eastnor, is fast establishing itself as one of the must go events of the year. With family activities from the ever popular circus workshops, to the various rides and crafts through to a new spoken word tent, a huge childrens area run by **Sarah Edwards** with **Spare Room Arts**, a creche and of course all that lovely live music on offer, the festival pretty much caters for everyone. It would seem that with a busy

Thursday night (complete with the likes of [Spunge] on entertainment duties) for all those early birds, the flocks are eager to kick start the party as early as possible.

Between main stage bands, I paid a number of visits to the BBC Introducing tent starting with an energetic set of youthful, infectious, indie pop from Stuart Woolfenden who had an appreciative crowd, bopping to the likes of



Letting Go and Seen It All. Hereford's **Last Tree Squad** followed and had the tent rocking as they mashed up a glorious combination of hip-hop, reggae, dub and jungle, rousing the crowd to shout along to the likes of *Skills* and *Join Us*. **Haunted Souls** brought the first day in the Introducing tent to a close with their effervescent, foot-stomping brand of bluesy country.



Over on the main stage, London based, widescreen electro indie pop act **Colouring** gripped with their effortless blend of skittering beats, subtle snyth melodies and soaring lead vocals. The explosive angular post-punk of **Yak** grabbed the audience by their collective lapels and shook violently as the band thrashed at their instruments, often thrillingly threatening to career out of control as the band delivered one of the most memorable sets of the entire



weekend. **Wilko Johnson** unsurprisingly packed them in for a full tilt set of strutting blues infused rock 'n' roll. Using his guitar as a machine gun, every duck walk was rightfully greeted with chorals of approval as the powerhouse trio (completed by **Norman Watt-Roy** on elastic bass, **Dylan Howe** on drums) swaggered through the likes of *So Confused* and *Going Back Home*.

Whilst the hordes hung around the main arena for **Feeder**, I took leave to check out a stunning set by percussion heavy, indietronica hopefuls, **Passion Bel Cannon**. They mixed an alluring combination of Bat For Lashes, Bjork and Florence & The Machine to bewitching effect on the likes of former singles *Stranger*, *Lights* and newbie *Ashes*, drawing day one to a sensational close.

Day Two kicked off with a bang as main stage openers **Moses** cleared any cobwebs with a festival stealing performance. Hitting the stage running, the London based foursome stole all the best bits from the Brit-pop era, threw in a punk **Molotov** and exploded with a frenzy of reverberated soaked riffs, high leaps and swaggering hooks. After such a frenetic start, **Tors** over on the **Floating Globe** offered a more subdued distraction, delivering a lovely set of harmony enriched folk before my first appointment back at The Introducing tent revealed the intoxicating tones of **Willow Robinson**.

The BBC sponsored stage continued to hold the attention with young blues band Sweet Talk delivering an impressive array of Hendrix and the three kings (that's Albert, BB and Freddie) inspired originals with frontman Owen Whittall delivering a six string masterclass despite his years. And later on I returned to the Introducing tent for BBC H&W's final band of the day, Arcadia Roots, a band that never fail to find a groove the entire audience can dance to. Sure enough, a rammed tent was throbbing to the bands bewitching roots and reggae beat, urging the band (hyped by front man Dave Small) for one more song after the band should have wrapped things up.



Away from the Introducing stage, I caught the ever wondrous **Elles Bailey** at **The Floating Globe** delivering her majestic husky blues and roots to a typically entranced audience. A dip into the new **Pen & Parchment** spoken word tent revealed the punk poets whilst over on the main stage, first **Turin Brakes** had the audience swaying to the likes of *Painkiller* and then acid-gospel-country-blues band **Alabama 3** broke down musical barriers to an appreciative, bouncing main arena.

By the final day of **Lakefest** there may well have been some muzzy heads and aching limbs out there but people were still very much in the party spirit of things turning out in force for the likes of **Nuns Of The Tundra** who once again had a hot and sticky tent simultaneously grooving and rocking. Straight after the Nuns, another local favourite in the form of Floating Globe **Marie-Claire Berren & Her Husbands** dazzled with their wide screen, harmony-enriched folk. Back with the Beeb the impossibly youthful **Riscas** hit the right notes with *Sugar* and their 1975

inspired infectious indie pop to a seemingly ever growing audience.

Badly Drawn Boy proved it was possible to hold the attention of the main arena with one guitar (and a seldom used piano). a beanie and a collection thought provoking acoustic laments as he picked at his impressive back catalogue. Coward Soul beckoned back to the 'globe with a stirring rendition of



Wagon Wheel and holding their own infectious Scarecrow, before the draw of **Seth Lakeman** had me scurrying back to the main stage for a stunning set, gripping the audience with one of the





most captivating sets of the weekend. Between Seth and festival closer **Imelda May** there was just enough time for a quick punky thrash with **Under A Banner** who duly delivered a rousing set of politically and socially aware anthems. And what can I say about **Imelda May** other than wow... it's been a while since I last caught Imelda and her change of direction and circumstances have been well documented but that voice is magnetic, drawing every single person in and holding them bewitched.

Congratulations to the organisers of **Lakefest** for another storming year and I'm already looking forward to the first announcements of 2018. Don't delay, book that time off work, snaffle an early bird ticket, see you down the front next year.

# Old Bush Blues Callow End | 18th-20th Aug

Whilst most festival Fridays limp into life, reaching a crescendo for the headlining band to close the evening, here at **The Old Bush**, **Matt Williams** has conjured up an incredible cluster of artists to throw at us from the get go. When I arrived, Old Avengers were playing. They've been around a while and know how to present classic blues to the early starters and steady influx of revellers.

**Files** Bailey provided a pleasant surprise for those vet to hear her. She and her band Joe. Zac and Matt are great, that's a given, but Elles really uses the stage, involving her audience and was lighting 'Wildfire' to warm them up. Despite the eulogy to Joplin,



Chess and Muscle Shoals, its 'Spoonful' and 'Let Me Hear You Scream' that has us all 'Howling' for more. Meanwhile Five Field Holler was warming up. Chris Saunders voice drifted across to me but it's the rhythm and funk of Robin's drums and Emile's bass that will pass the distance test as Marco's boogie notes fill in the hollows. The band offered up blues that have a jazz fusion and a soul synergy woven in.



Another quickly rising band who is storming all the festival stages is **The Rainbreakers** and they were set to bring their totally absorbing style of play to The Old Bush. Everything about The Rainbreakers shouts of quality and a synergy that would disgrace many more established bands —

they had superb percussion, electric lead, thumping bass and great vocals. Stepping back across into the Car Park stage I found Ian Parker carrying out an impressive sound check. This is a man who is quite simply on the rise. Ian knows how to eke out the best, most beautiful sounds from his Strat whilst being accompanied sublime drums from Al Cormell, Dave Jenkins on bass and the unmissable sounds from Morg Morgans keys that brought a stunned the crowd into reverential silence.



**Trafficker**, a hard rocking sometimes blues band fresh from Upton, ensured that as rain filled the air, spirits weren't dampened as the garden stage was packed as tightly as a sardine can. Closing the evening was another rising band who are generating a lot of interest - **The Tom Walker Band**. I had work to do, but will catch one of his gigs and maybe take home his new recording Into Space for some sweet guitar and the soulful voice of Tom.

Friday was phenomenal so how can you dig out a super Saturday or even stunning Sunday to follow? It's true to say just sticking in **Northsyde** will satisfy most, but Saturday started with a superb set from **Steve Whalley**. Essentially acoustic, though he picked up his electric at the end, he plays some lovely



acoustic blues that adds slide before moving to mandolin. This along with the characterful voice that can grit out the lyrics left me wondering what else you need.

Then the lovely tones of Lucy Zirens are drifting across the lawn. This is apparently the first standing gig in 10 years and Lucy is limbering up for an electric guitar.... sacrilege? We'll see, meanwhile Northsyde took the stage, picked it up and gave it and shaking.



This was one of those nights that stay etched in the memory for ever. Jules, Ian, and Hayden tease the best from Lorna as she

covers the stage like a spider, spinning a web. Northsyde draw in the collective energy of the whole festival that is crammed into this one arena. They use it, abuse it, transform it, tossing it to Lorna as she blasts it out with her coffee grinder voice and back into the open arms of the bobble-hatted electrified listeners.



Sunday morning would bring **Kyle & Shaw** with an acoustic; traditional blues set – a fine way to ease you in to the day. The **Delray Rockets** were

sure to have the girls up and dancing to the rockabilly roll - a local and very popular band. **Lavender Rouge** was listed for later. I'd

missed them in Upton and, due to prior engagements, was about to miss this eclectic, colourful band again; soon maybe? Closing this year's festival was **Troy Redfern** who I had seen the weekend before. It was going to be quite an experience for those who have not yet seen Troy and his band. It was another excellent year with **Matt Williams** and the staff at **The Old Bush**, giving all a memorable weekend.

From the very beginning **Tom Forbes** set to work on blowing the audience away with his dizzy set full of layered gold. It was the right sound to conclude the sunny Monday afternoon to.

# Troy Redfern Band The Prince Of Wales, Ledbury | 13th Aug

Don't expect to come to a **Troy Redfern** gig for a quiet evening of gentle conversation and a diet coke because the reality is going to be hard edged, bitingly raw, rock blues. Troy, modelled on an early version of John Mayall with brimmed hat, long wild hair and short beard, carries a selection of weapons: a Gibson Les Paul, Gibson 335, Fender Strat, and a 60's Silvertone. Troy is very ably assisted by **Alex Bridge** on percussion and **Stjohn Milinczuk** on bass.

In the close atmosphere of this great little pub, the sound was going to be galvanising. The windows rattle to the opening of thunderous rock before shuffling on to a superb rhythmic drum intro to the highly appropriate 'Shake Em'. The energy loaded openers make way for the

slow burning blues of Troy's 'Salvation', taken from his Back Door Hoodoo album. It slides and twists as Troy's nut grinder voice spits out the grit before Albert Collins' 'Black Cat Bone' is chewed over ahead of a smouldering 'Double Trouble' that saw Troy wringing the neck of his Les Paul.

The old Silvertone is given a rock n' roll workout for 'Jelly Roll', loosening up for the tonal testing and guttural mutterings of 'Backdoor Hoodoo'. We all watch and listen, heads are nodding as feet are tapping to the primeval, lava flowing, rock forming, creativity that is the **Troy Redfern Band**. Alex and Stjohn generate the strata as the guitar and vocals percolate from the molten core, bursting and streaming through every fissure before 'Madman Blues' shifts and dodges, robbing lyrics and riffs.



The band restarted with a good dose of 'Spoonful', needless to say a fully spiked Redfern edition which would have seen Ewan McGregor well and truly round the U bend. A crackling, sparking 'Wildfire' raged with Alex and Stjohn blasted through. Stjohn is like a caged bull, wanting to charge across a ring but The Prince forces all to play close to their chest with no room for a rampage. I took my leave, unfortunately not hearing the raging seas conjured up for 'Wade In The Water' or even the glorious 'John The Revelator', but I will be catching up with Troy again at the imminent Old Bush Blues. Here at The Prince Of Wales, it had been a revelation. After a little while since seeing the band, this seemed so much better: better sound, better environment and better beer!


